



School District No. 64 (Gulf Islands) invites applications for the continuing 1.0 FTE position of Principal of Galiano Community School and Mayne Island Elementary/Jr. Secondary School commencing August 1, 2018. This is a teaching/administrative position in K-12 schools with an enrollment of approximately 50 students at Galiano Community School plus a Strong Start Centre and 25 students at Mayne Island Elementary/Jr. Secondary School plus a Strong Start Centre. Mayne Island and Galiano Island are located in the Southern Gulf Islands in the Salish Sea (Strait of Georgia), between Vancouver and Victoria.

The successful candidate will be responsible for the operation of the schools and for the delivery of high quality programs to students from pre-school to Grade 12. This is a position that requires a great deal of flexibility, teamwork, creativity, patience, and a passion for environmental, place-based and differentiated education.

- Commitment to contemporary best practices in assessment, pedagogy, and school leadership
- Exemplary experience in current best practices in literacy and numeracy instruction and assessment and in restorative approaches
- Ability to develop and operationalize educational plans for students with diverse learning needs through appropriate differentiation of instruction and support
- Ability to implement the goals in the District's Aboriginal Education Enhancement Agreement
- An understanding and appreciation of a small school's benefits and challenges
- Relevant technology literacy
