**The District Speech and Language Pathologist will:**

- Coordinate Speech-Language Services with school teams
- Collaborate with school teams in support of IEP development and curriculum delivery for students who require Speech Language services i.e. team teaching, IEP adaptations and modifications
- Foster the development of strong literacy and numeracy skills by utilizing a variety of communications techniques, instructional skills, and teaching methodologies
- Integrate information and communication technologies to support teaching and learning
- Work with the Multidisciplinary Team and other Learning Services team members to provide support services across the district
- Establish, with School Based Teams, a method of service delivery that includes caseload selection and scheduling, record keeping, evaluating programs, developing instructional materials and scheduling and supervising speech-language assistant

- Master's Degree or equivalent in Speech Language Pathology (or in progress)
- Registered with the College of Speech and Hearing Health Professionals of BC

- Proven ability to integrate the use of technology to support an effective learning environment
- Ability to carry out a variety of informal and formal educational assessments, including classroom observation and curriculum-based assessments
